Shipboard Program Coordinator:

The Bayshore Center at Bivalve's mission is to inspire people to take care of the environment, history, and culture of New Jersey's Bayshore region through education, preservation, and example. - Prepare monthly and end of year reports, trawl reports and applications, etc; Maintain records, evaluations, and equipment and supplies
