JOB DESCRIPTION: Mate / Nautical Educator

The Mate/Nautical Educator directly supports the Captain and works with the Captain and Deckhand/Nautical Educator to ensure a safe environment aboard the 61' sailing vessel. Mate/Nautical Educator works as part of the team to deliver nautical science lessons underway. Salish Sea Expeditions works with groups of 5th-12th grade students. Trips range from 3-5 Day Expeditions (overnight) as well as 1-Day programs. The Program Coordinator is one member of the six-person Education Team, working together to deliver quality inquiry-based & hands on marine science research programs. All crew members aboard the vessel participate in all shipboard duties: vessel operations, line handling, docking, night watch, cleaning, etc.

PRIMARY RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Instructing and overseeing staff and students in proper vessel operation
- Presenting nautical science topics to groups of 14 students on the vessel and in the classroom
- Teaching a variety of sailing and navigation classes underway to groups of up to 14 students
- In the evening goes to shore to assist with camp set up, cooking, and other evening activities, however sleeps onboard in addition to the captain
- Office duties: assist in food and supply packing, preparing paperwork for expeditions, assisting
 with classroom sessions pre- and post-expedition tasks, and logistical projects
- Attending events as a representative of Salish Sea Expeditions and program development as necessary
- Other duties as assigned

GENERAL OPERATIONS

While this position's primary responsibility is in instructing and overseeing staff and students in proper vessel operation and nautical instruction, the Mate/Nautical Educator will work as part of the Salish Sea Expeditions and Northwest Maritime Center team to ensure smooth operations for the organization as a whole. Integral to the success of Salish Sea Expeditions and our hands-on, boat-based programs is a crew full of knowledgeable, curious, enthusiastic, and self-motivated educators. We aim to create a generation of critical thinkers who will collaborate to solve society's hardest problems.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS

- 50 ton Inland Mates license (or greater) with sail endorsement
- Experience teaching sailing and navigation
- Demonstrated ability to handle and maintain a vessel as well as safely manage the deck
- Demonstrated ability to instruct staff and students in proper vessel operation to ensure safety

















- Experience with small boats + outboard engines
- Ability to be an effective leader when necessary, as well as a sailing team member
- Experience working with 10-16-year-olds
- Current first aid/CPR
- Enthusiasm for working outdoors in all types of weather
- Ability to lift and carry gear up to 50lbs
- Ability to work well both individually and as a team member, as well as independently with small and large groups of students
- Ability to stay positive when working with crew and students over multiple days in relatively confined spaces of the vessel
- Proactive work ethic: willingness to help in any aspects of programming as necessary
- Fully vaccinated against COVID-19, including booster (staff will be subject to COVID testing prior to overnight trips)
- Ability to pass pre-employment background check and drug test The NWMC boat-based programs are drug, alcohol, and tobacco free. Throughout employment with the Northwest Maritime Center, certain boat-based program employees will be enrolled in a random drug testing program administered by the Maritime Consortium, in compliance with the Coast Guard mandatory drug testing regulation, as contained in 46 CFR part 16.

- Experience with sailing vessels >60ft
- BST or other maritime safety training
- WFA/WFR/EMT certification
- Interest in marine science and science education

During programming you may be sleeping on a boat or in a tent. Meals while running a program are provided, otherwise, you will be responsible for providing your own food.
